FOR JUSTICE OF THE PEACE		Question 2: Shall the Town of Hartford advise the Selectboard to forward the attached resolution on Renewable Energy to the State of Vermont? WHEREAS climate change is one of the most urgent problems facing our state, nation, and the world, and WHEREAS, the vast majority of the scientific community recognizes fossil fuel and the expansion of fossil fuel infrastructure to be a major cause of climate change, and WHEREAS, climate scientists predict that New England will experience an increase in the frequency and intensity of severe weather events and flooding, such as Tropical Storm Irene in 2011, and WHEREAS, the State of Vermont has a goal in the Comprehensive Energy Plan to meet 90% of its remaining energy needs from renewable sources and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 80-95% below 1990 levels by 2050, yet has so far seen a moderate increase in emissions and at this rate will not meet its renewable energy goals. Now, therefore, be it resolved: That the Town urges the State of Vermont to: a. Halt any new or expansion of significant fossil fuel infrastructure, including but not limited to pipelines; and b. Firmly commit to 90% renewable energy for all people in Vermont; and c. Ensure that the transition to renewable energy is fair and equitable for all residents.
